Board Report

Fall is almost here and while the trees are starting to change color, the warm weather continues into mid-September. Because of this and the late opening, the pool closing was postponed until September 24, allowing swimmers to enjoy a bit more time in the water before the season ends.

Fall is also a time when activities that went on summer hiatus resume and the Recreation Centre again comes alive with residents enjoying a full schedule of events. The Hickory Hills Board is excited to host the Volunteer Wine and Cheese Appreciation event to recognize the dedication and support of Convenors and volunteers who consistently help ensure that activities can continue. The event will take place on Sunday, October 5, from 2:00 – 4:00 in the Main Hall.

The 2025/26 phone books will be published soon. To clarify questions about a "delay," the publication occurs only after both the May Annual General Meeting (AGM), where Board Directors are elected, and the annual Convenor meeting. The Board Vice President must first have an updated list of Convenors before the phone book can be finalized and sent for publication.

Once the phone books are ready for pickup, an announcement will be made on Condo Control and an email will be sent to all residents. Please note that again this year, a \$1.00 charge will be applied to help offset printing costs.

Two news items from the Town Council directly affect our Hickory Hills community. Firstly, regarding speed limits on Wilson Drive, the recent traffic study indicated that most vehicles travel at speeds of 40 kph or less; however, some vehicles were recorded going as fast as 60, 70, and just under 80 kph. As a result, Resolution #2025-314 was passed, which directs Town staff to prepare a report on the feasibility of installing removable soft speed bumps or humps during the winter, along with other traffic calming measures for Wilson Avenue at the northern end of Jackson Court. This report will be sent to the Traffic Advisory Committee for further consideration. Secondly, under consideration is that the temporary three-way stop at Wilson Avenue and Baldwin Street will be made permanent.

Board report continued:

We will keep you updated on the developments regarding these proposals as the reports are completed. Thank you to all residents who have shared their concerns with the Board and Town Councillors.

The Board is busy working on the budget for 2025/26 and the Information Meeting is scheduled for October 15, 2025. It will start at 10:00, with registration beginning at 9:15. Packages will be distributed to your mailboxes in early October.

We would like to express our sincere gratitude to the residents who take the time to email the Board or speak with Directors about their questions and concerns. This is the best way for us to understand what is important to our community members. We cannot address concerns that are not brought to our attention.

A. Bake Table (main hall)
